KMFAL

The Kettle Moraine Field Archery League was founded in 1948 by Clai Spaulding of Oconomowoc. It is made up of clubs within a 75-mile radius of Eagle WI. The objective of the KMFAL or KM, is to improve, advance, and protect the interest of archery as a competitive sport. All members of the KM member clubs are considered members of the KM and are eligible to receive awards.

In 1953 Clai Spaulding decided there should be a special award given to an archer who promoted archery well above the norm. The first Silver Arrow Award was given to Dutch Henning in 1956. This started the Silver Arrow Club, an organization of people who are interested in the promotion of archery within the KM. Each year the member clubs in the KM are asked to submit names of people who have done outstanding promotional work in the in the KM. The current members of the Silver Arrow Club select a new member from the nominations.

Before his death, Clai donated a gift to start an archery museum at the West Allis Bowmen Archery Club. Within the museum there is a list of the Silver Arrow Club members and many early archery historical items. Everyone is welcome to visit the club to look at the museum.

All shooting fees collected are used for promoting the KM and awards. No money is used for personal reasons. The KM turns over 5% of the shooting fees collected each

year to the Silver Arrow Club.

KM meetings are held twice a year. The time and location are decided by the KMFAL board and Club Representatives. Each club has two representatives. All KM members are welcome to attend the meetings.

The KM typically follows the NFAA rules and shooting divisions with the following modifications:

1. Male and female competitors are combined in the same divisions.
2. One Senior competitor age group starting at 50 years old.

Adult Spot Target Team Event (18 and over): The top four individual scores of the members of the club team are used to determine the team score.

Kids Spot Target Team Event (17 and under): The top four individual scores are to be used with the same procedures as the adult teams.

Animal Target Team Event: The top four individual scores of the members of the club team are used to determine the team score.

There are no extra shooting fees charged to shoot on the club team. All archers must designate only the club team that they are shooting for.

Each KM Club shoot is a tournament within itself. Individual awards (Pins) will be

awarded on a 3-6-9 basis. Adult flights are determined by past scoring within the KM series. Individual KM season series awards (Silver Seasonal Pin, Championship Jacket and Patch) require competing in a minimum of four (4) of the eight (8) KM indoor club shoots. There must be a minimum of three (3) competitors in the division to receive the KM Series awards. A plaque will be awarded to each top Club Team winner.

Results will be printed and provided at the following KMFAL Club shoot, posted on the KMFAL Website and on the KMFAL Facebook page.

Online pre-registration will be required at all shoots. Line times and shooting lane limitations are pre-set for Friday night, Saturday, and Sunday at each shooting location. You can go to either the KMFAL Web Site and click on the link or pre-registrar at <https://squadfusion.com>. Walk-ons will be allowed if space is available, check with the club prior to showing up at the shoot.

New for the 2023-24 Indoor Season

This year there will be a 30-arrow money round shooting the Vegas Face Target. The purse fee will be \$10 with 100% payback. The Animal Target Round will also be 30 arrows and the Animal Team event has been added.
